UAE Response:

- UAE Red Crescent Authority:**
 - RCA sent a delegation on 19 June to assess the situation and needs of the internally displaced persons and refugees. The Delegation plans to purchase local commodities from Uzbekistan markets and distribute relief supplies to conflict victims in cooperation with the Uzbek Red Crescent and International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC). The initial cost of the assistance is valued at AED 500,000.
 - UAE Red Crescent is supporting five refugee camps with water trucking for three months. The project is implemented by the Uzbekistan Red Crescent.
- International Humanitarian City (IHC)**
 - IHC is cooperating with a number of UN agencies (World Food Programme and UNHCR) to use its Dubai-based depots to airlift relief supplies to the conflict victims in Kyrgyzstan.

LATEST DEVELOPMENTS

On 23 June, the UN launched on a flash for Uzbekistan requesting AED 141,703,117 to provide assistance for refugees (this is separate from the flash appeal for Kyrgyzstan).

The situation in Osh has improved since last week. There appears to be access to food in the city and some public transportation is working. However, security risks remain high, particularly at night.

Northern Kyrgyzstan remains tense, with widespread concerns about the possibility for violence connected to the constitutional referendum planned for 27 June.

The Border Guards Service reported that a total of 35,000 people returned from Uzbekistan.

UNHCR is carrying out a survey with its governmental and non-governmental partners to identify population movements and locations. As of 22 June, the location of 112,800 internally displaced people (IDPs) of whom 91,300 are in Osh Province and 21,500 in Jalal-Abad province has been confirmed. There are six locations in the two provinces where 62,240 people are accommodated in either schools or kindergartens or are sleeping out in the open. Others are living with host families.

The Government of Uzbekistan increased its estimate of the number of refugees in the camps from 75,000 to 100,000. The Government is managing 46 refugee settlements in tented camps and public buildings.

HUMANITARIAN NEEDS

Kyrgyzstan

Health

- Ministry of Health is working with ICRC and MSF in areas where there is a concentration of IDPs.
- World Health Organization is sending emergency health kits to cover basic health needs of 60,000 people for one month.
- UNICEF's convoy of trucks arrived on 21 June carrying 60 tons of medical supplies to be distributed to hospitals and places of IDP concentration in Jalal-Abad and Osh.

Food

- A WFP cargo flight from the UN Humanitarian Response Depot in Dubai, loaded with 20 metric tons of high-energy fortified biscuits, enough to feed 30,000 people, landed in Osh, southern Kyrgyzstan, on 21 June.
- Early this week WFP released 585 tons of flour and oil from their Osh warehouse. Most has been donated to the ICRC for their operations. WFP is distributing the rest through local NGO partners.
- Russian embassy delivered ready-to-eat food items to areas of Bishkek.

Shelter and Non-Food Items (NFI)

- The German Red Cross will be providing 3,000 family hygiene kits, 5,000 blankets, 5,000 mattresses and 1,000 kitchen sets through the Red Crescent Society of Kyrgyzstan.
- ICRC will provide non-food items to 100,000 people in southern Kyrgyzstan next week.

Logistics and Telecommunication

- WFP delivered an armoured vehicle, office supplies and emergency telecom equipment for a humanitarian hub providing the international relief effort with a base of operations in southern Kyrgyzstan.

Uzbekistan

Shelter and Non-food items

- Sixty tons of supplies had been delivered to Andijan airport from UNHCR's depot in Dubai (tents, mattresses, blankets, kitchen sets).
- UNICEF delivered seventeen trucks of supplies from its emergency stockpile in Uzbekistan and some locally procured (tents, cooking kits, water containers, blankets, clothes, recreation kits and Education Kits).

Health

- UNICEF delivered 24 Emergency Health Kits in Andijan.

Food Security

- 40 tons of ready-to-eat food was delivered to Andijan and 518 tons of mixed food commodities are available for distribution by WFP, pending transport.
- A WFP plane arrived in Andijan on 20 June with 40 tons of biscuits.

Water and Sanitation

- UNICEF delivered 108,000 water purification tablets and 20,000 basic personal hygiene kits.
